I am delighted to nominate Christopher D. Hopkins for membership in the American College of Real Estate Lawyers.

Chris is a consummate real estate professional, highly regarded by all in the New Jersey real estate community. I have worked with Chris over the past several years in planning and speaking at an advanced leasing program sponsored by the New Jersey Institute for Continuing Legal Education. Chris has played an active role in the planning process, as well as speaking at and writing for these programs. 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In sum, I strongly believe that Chris is an outstanding real estate practitioner, is extremely intelligent, is willing to share his knowledge and experience through his writing and speaking activities, and has tremendous integrity. I am pleased to nominate Chris for membership in ACREL. He will be a credit to the college.
